



Nuno Lobo Antunes is a Pediatric Neurologist.

He was trained in Portugal at the Lisbon University, and in the USA at the Neurologic Institute of New York of Columbia University.

He was assistant professor of pediatrics and neurology at Cornell University, and attending pediatric neurologist at Memorial Sloan-Kettering in New York. As a medical student he was privileged to develop neuropsychological research with Antonio Damásio.

For the last 15 years, he has been deeply interested in the clinical study of children and adolescents with developmental and behavior problems, and has been clinical director of two of the most respected Child Development Centers in Portugal. He is the Clinical Director and founder of "PIN - Progresso Infantil". He has published extensively on the field, and is the author of a best-seller "Mal-Entendidos" - ("Misunderstood") a book for teachers and parents on ADHD, Dyslexia, autism and other learning difficulties.

He has been invited as a speaker all over the country, but also in the USA, Switzerland, Brazil, Spain and Angola. He was also invited to speak at the Congress of the European International Schools twice, on issues related to learning and behaviour. He has been in Switzerland to speak with teachers in international schools about these topics.

He was the CEO of the Make - a Wish foundation in Portugal.

He was awarded honours by the Pfizer company as a researcher, and nominated professional of the year by the Rotary Club.

He is also a celebrated author with several best-sellers both on fiction and non-fiction.
