6.1.	Oral communications M Schlabe explained that EC/NP is a meeting where we do not have to vote and it thus has no importance how many teachers or parents are present. Harriet Kirby hosted the meeting and replaced Mrs Ivanauskiene. Mrs Kirby reported about the very successful opening of the Romanian section , which contributed to a great start for everybody. She also reported about the fantastic Art week in N/P which showed the great talent of the children. (we saw great pictures with wonderful master pieces!)	
6.2.	School plan presentation N/P: Enrollments: The input to the school plan comes mainly from the Direction but also from the teachers. Mr Schlabe explained that the school plan should	

	<p>soon be ready because an inspection is announced. Mrs Kirby showed a draft document which identifies “quality areas, objectives, actions, responsible, timeline and evaluation” and describes where the school would like to arrive.</p>	
6.3.	<p>Plan for the future:</p> <p>As the school grows we have to adapt and change. The process of adaptation and change will be ongoing. The Romanian section is growing very healthily, which has a significant impact on some other sections like English which is becoming slowly smaller and there may eventually be 1 section per class due to the creation of Bulgarian and Romanian section.</p> <p>Canteen: The canteen lacks space for the growing school population. Therefore, school and APEEE are looking into plan for a third canteen service next school year and/or to shorten the lunch break. As the tartinistes are concerned more space will be needed next year, too if necessary. Currently there is no proposal for an appropriate long term location. The garderie may need to find a new home, as it also expands and maybe room sharing will be necessary which mean that a room for the tartinistes must be properly equipped. Sec school: as they will have exams, they will have to use the salle polyvalente, but we have to keep in mind that we still want to have a room for performances, and concerts.</p> <p>Mr Schlabe repeated his wish that all children should eat in the canteen but the number of tartinistes is growing.</p> <p>APEEE occupies 4 rooms in the building, it may happen that some of them will be used as classrooms</p>	
6.4.	<p>Working groups:</p> <p>There are three major WG’s:</p> <p><u>Sexual Education WG</u> where there is one parent representative, 1 N Teacher, 2 P teachers and 4-5 SEC teachers: school would aim for a seamless flow starting from N and towards the end of the SEC</p> <p><u>Assessment group:</u> We look at the role of the portfolio, the concept is new for teachers, from some countries, and more familiar to others: discussions to make sure how it should be: it’s a folder, project book which each child has for their year in school. The child uses it to become more self-reflective, and can share with parents what he/she is learning at school. It should be ready for introduction as of next school year.</p> <p><u>Pedagogical WG:</u> Developing curriculum maps</p>	
6.5.	<p>M/P Projects and Events:</p> <p>Mrs Kirby congratulated the M teachers for their excellent work. Mr Schlabe underlined again the importance of not putting videos on “you tube” because it may cause problems, there will therefore be an announcement at the beginning of the Christmas Concert where they will say it expressly.</p> <p>Shoe-Box project: Teachers are pleased to do it again, to help homeless people. Children like to bring something from their home to someone else who hasn’t got anything.</p> <p>Medori project: the Medori institution asked the school if they can sell</p>	

	their sweets and biscuits and it has been decided to accept this on the Christmas concert's day so that the children don't have to come to school with money and the parents decide whether their children should eat sweets, not to go against the healthy school program!!	
6.6.	From the Maternelle Nursery coordinator, present a power point project: explaining the early education curriculum with pictures of the children learning about colors, music, etc. It's very nice and the children seem already to be artists, as we could see from their masterpieces after being to some visits to Folon's and Magritte's museums.
